19:05 Brickline Greenway Update presented by Shaughnessy Daniels of Great Rivers Greenway. More info: https://greatriversgreenway.org/brickline/

- Great Rivers Greenway is a tax-payer funded regional agency (focused on STL city, county, and St. Charles) that has already developed 16 active greenways, including 120+ miles of existing trails.
- Brickline Greenway will be like a linear park and will have up to 20 miles of walking/biking paths across 17 neighborhoods.
- Project is currently in the community engagement phase. Already had a design competition, 13 steering committees, engagement with artists, utility companies, etc.
- Goals: Connect the former Chouteau's pond area to new Cortex area; including developments like Armory and Foundry. Connect Tower Grove Park to Fountain Park, from Grand to 20th, and from Harris Stowe to MLS Stadium.
