You may find yourself living in an historic district

At the June meeting of the Gibson Heights Neighborhood Association - Block Unit 5, Alderman Roddy announced that he is considering proposing that Forest Park Southeast be designated an historic district. Much of the preliminary

work required for this designation had been completed by Roddy's predecessor, Tim Dee. Several other areas within the city, such as Souldard and Lafayette Square, have been historic districts for many years. Because limited information was presented at the meeting, FOPARSE NEWS & VIEWS contacted various city agencies to learn more about what the designation would mean to our neighborhood and its residents.

According to the Heritage and Urban Design Commission, historic districts are established by city ordinance. The goal of the designation is to preserve buildings within the district and to encourage restoration. Within the boundaries of the district strict standards are enforced regarding exterior alterations to buildings. Any facade changes would have to meet city approval.

The standards established are unique to each district. In some historic districts, no storm windows are allowed, nor are window air conditioners or even TV antennas if they are visible from the street. Other districts permit the use of only certain color paints on exterior trim and prohibit all but a few types of fencing.

Realizing the need for neighborhood-wide discussion and involvement in establishing standards, Concerned Citizens is considering sponsoring a meeting so as to provide Alderman Roddy with an oppor-

tunity to address all of the residents of Forest Park Southeast.
